The purpose of this letter is not only to send some new information, but also some important reminders about being in the school building. Please read this letter thoroughly and call the office at (269) 565-2460 with any questions.

CCHS will be back to the In-Person Learning Support schedule beginning Monday Jan. 25, 2021. A.M. students need to be on time for 1st block beginning at 8:00 a.m., lunch is from 11:00-11:25 a.m. Students MUST be out of the building by 11:30 a.m. P.M. students can have lunch before 3rd block from 11:55-12:20 p.m., 3rd block starts promptly at 12:25 p.m., dismissal is at 3:20 p.m.

Picture Retakes will be done on Thursday Feb. 25th, from 11:30-1:30 p.m. We strongly encourage Virtual students to have their photo taken so they receive a picture i.d. Orders can be placed online at the Lifetouch website, more information will be published regarding online ordering as picture retake day gets closer.

Every student enrolled in the 2020-2021 school year will receive a school spirit sweatshirt from the district. YES they are free to you, students! It is the responsibility of the student to pick up their sweatshirt from Mrs. Olsen at the school, they will not be delivered. 

What is ENGAGE Michigan?

For many students, going from a traditional classroom to learning from home can be a real challenge. Michigan's Department of Education has partnered with Graduation Alliance to provide an extra layer of support for students in grades k-12 and their families who might be struggling with these changes.

Students who choose to participate in the program will get an academic coach to work with them to answer questions, connect them with resources, and develop a plan to get on track and finish the school year strong.

How does it work?

Graduation Alliance is reaching out to students through phone calls, emails, text messages and more to get students started.
